### *Share the Gifts*

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in Communion.

*A reminder to make use of hand sanitizer before receiving communion.*

If you are not physically receiving Communion, then offer this prayer: **In union, O God, with all your faithful people gathered wherever the eucharist is celebrated this day, I offer you praise and thanksgiving for creation and all the blessings of this life, for the redemption given to us through the life, death and resurrection of Christ, and for the means of grace and the hope of glory. I pray you come into my heart, my soul and my mind. Let nothing separate me from you. May I serve you in this life until, by your grace, I come to your promised reign of justice and peace; through Christ and in the unity of the Spirit. Amen.** *While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence—this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.*
