for in the ocean of your steadfast love you bear us and place the song of your Spirit in our hearts. When we turn from your love and defile the earth,



Gracious God,

Both weddings offer a huge variety of interesting repertoire, keeping us on our vocal and mental "toes!"

For the music today, we welcome soloist Chelsea Numanga. Originally from New Zealand, Chelsea moved to Vancouver in May of last year. She has sung in several secular choirs over the last 20 years, including school choirs, regional choirs, one 3 year cycle of the NZ Secondary Students Choir, and 3 cycles of the NZ Youth Choir. She later continued her vocal studies at the university level in an opera program. Regarding sacred choirs, she sang in her College Chapels both in high school and in my university Hall; she also helped out with her parent's church choir over the years. More recently she was a member of the Schola Choir at Old St Patrick's Basilica in New York. She joined the Cathedral choir very recently at the beginning of June this year. For the music today, I had also booked our dear friend and superb oboe player - Erin Marks. Unfortunately she contracted COVID last Tuesday, so will not be able to join. I already booked her for Sunday Sept 4th.
