Healing Pathway Phase 1

Phase 1 is an introduction to the basic concepts of hands-on healing within the Christian tradition, with an emphasis on learning to be a healing presence and instrument of God's healing power. This workshop includes the following:

- ~ Discussion of the primary basis for a healing ministry
- ~ Discussion of the traditional, scriptural, and spiritual sources of Christian centred healing
- ~ Brief introduction to the human energy system
- ~ Presentation and review of the Healing Pathway Code of Ethics, including boundaries
- ~ Discussion about the elements of self-care that support the physical, emotional, intellectual, and spiritual well-being of the practitioner
- ~ Centering and grounding through prayer and meditation, as preparation for offering healing hands
- ~ Experiencing being a heart-centred instrument of healing
- ~ Description, demonstration, and practice of a Healing Sequence and specific healing techniques, including:
- ~ Discussion about the application of a ministry of healing within the church and community.
